WHAT IS IT

A fabric collage design / adventure holiday in the hills of Noosa.

HOW DOES IT WORK

From photographs and biological illustrations of those already fantastical creatures – the rooster and the fish - you will learn to capture their movement and character with pencil on paper, to look deep into your fabric prints with a brand new eye, turning leaves into fins, flowers into chicken heads, circles into body parts. A Fantastical Fabric Collage – ready for wall hanging, or to play the hero of your next quilt.

BUT I CAN'T DRAW

I can't draw either. But I can make large bold marks on paper. And so can you. Our bold marks are just note taking, a step towards showing off our beautiful fabric and excellent stitching skills – in our own inimitable styles.

Hand applique or machine applique

I am a hand applique girl, always looking for new and fancy ways to stitch fabric to fabric without glue or fusible web. BUT I have had many participants who are machine girls and have produced brilliant results with their sticky applique and machine skills. Machine sewing is done post workshop back at home.

We'll make a large and a small piece. The small piece can be hand stitched in the workshop.
